The Murrabit Advancement Association (MAA) recently held its Annual General Meeting. The MAA is made up of representatives from our local community groups who work together to improve our little town as a great place to live and visit.

After purchasing the former Uniting Church property, the main project completed was the second stage to upgrade the Murrabit Family Hub (playgroup building) which involved removing the bottom third of the building and adding corrugated iron.

With flood recovery funding received from Gannawarra Shire Council we were able to fund live music and children activities at the market, such as a bouncing castle and Billabong Ranch animal nursery, as well as the 100th anniversary of the town.

Disaster Management Training was held in the Murrabit Hall and the hall also received a donated generator and pump for use in future floods from the Kerang Neighbourhood House.

The Men's Shed attracted a flood recovery grant to redo the community garden and this funding was invested into a new community garden at the front of the Market office building in the centre of town. The Little Library was also installed and a new photocopier was purchased thanks to funding from FRRR.

There has continued to be lots of great events hosted. Examples have included two men's shed breakfasts, a bus trip to the Nyah Tractor Museum, Party in a Paint Box Workshop, Mosaic Workshop, Weaving Workshop, Frocktober event to raise funds for ovarian cancer, Australia Day Breakfast, ANZAC and Remembrance Day, Murrabit Cod Challenge, Easter Tennis Tournament, and the inaugural Murrabit Rodeo, which was an amazing success. We also had the National Motoring Day Federation Vintage Car Picnic on the market site for the second year and activated the town to support this great event.

The Recreation Reserve was named the Vince Maher Recreation Reserve, and we said goodbye to a founding member of the MAA, Hugh Webb.and

founding members of the Murrabit & District Heritage Group, Dick Walters and Alex Monk.

During the year we supported the start-up of the Crafty & Chatty Group and helped get Murrabit Playgroup back up and running.

Both groups are now running successfully.

The hall floor was refurbished and has hosted a range of events including monthly social meals,





Melbourne Cup Luncheon and Hall Stories by renowned comedian, Damian Callinan. We celebrated the market's 48th anniversary in November 2025. All of this work is thanks to a group of hardworking and

enthusiastic volunteers who work together to ensure Murrabit continues to be a great place to visit and live. Coming up is the final Murrabit Country Market for 2025. This market will also mark the end of an era with the Murrabit Group School and Murrabit Netball Club finishing up their morning tea operations in the hall. The morning teas in the hall have been an integral part of the Murrabit Country Market since the market commenced 48 years ago. Over the years there have only been four operators of the morning teas - the Murrabit Public Hall Ladies Auxiliary, Lake Charm Hall Committee, Murrabit Pre-School and since the preschool closed in 2001 the morning teas have been run jointly by the Murrabit Group School/Netball Club. Well done to all families who have supported the morning tea operations in the Murrabit Hall over these 25 years. Hall Stories by Damian Callinan

Laughter echoed through Murrabit Hall for the performance of Hall Stories by renowned comedian, Damian Callinan!

What a fantastic night it was. Damian had the audience roaring with laughter from start to finish. His sharp humour and clever storytelling brought to life memories of times gone by — made even better with local yarns about the old picture nights, debutante balls and even a special celebration of the Coulter's who were married in the Murrabit Hall 49 years ago to the day! (pictured right)

Jeanette and Gary Coulter were married on 23 October 1976 and had their reception at the Murrabit Hall. It was the day of the full solar eclipse, and the photographer was concerned that it would be dark for the photos once they came out of the church. Thankfully the priest banged on a bit and the eclipse was over by the time they came out. As it was their 49th anniversary on the night of the Hall Stories show, we recreated the wedding complete with flower girls, ring bearers, and a full black out mid ceremony. Gary hesitated during the renewal of the vows, but not when told he could kiss the bride. When revealed that the wedding dress on display was Jeanettes, but it was originally her mums and that her daughter also wore it, the audience registered 100 on the sentimental scale! The 'wedding ceremony ended with the cutting of a wedding cake, made especially for the occasion. Other stories included in the Hall Stories show:

Why did the men gravitate to Major's Butcher shop across the street from the Murrabit Hall on the night of the dances? Was it a refuge for those who couldn't dance or was it because there was keg of beer going in the cool room? Probably a bit of Column A & B!

The Murrabit Hall Committee and Murrabit and District Heritage Group went above and beyond with historical displays tailored for the night, including wedding and debutante dresses worn in the hall, the secret recipe for the infamous Murrabit Coffee and a display on all the uses the hall has seen over the years. Oh, the stories the walls of the Murrabit Hall could tell!

We heard John Danson and Terry Morton (pictured below) talk of being emotionally scarred by seeing the 'Creature of the Black Lagoon' as young lads on movie night; Elaine Curtis (nee Harvey) and Margaret Jobling (nee Day) talked us through their Debutante Ball held in 1956 and how the photographer had creatively added front teeth to Margaret's partner in the photos.





Some of the other stories recalled...

One night a local man was laughing so hard that his false teeth fell onto the floor!

When a wedding breakfast was to be held in the Murrabit Hall, all the guild ladies would bring along their best crockery and cutlery to be used.

A wedding breakfast once had crayfish cocktails on the entrée menu - all the local men had their cray nets in the Murray River hoping to catch enough crays for the meal!

Some of the local youths put crackers in the vents at the Hall and the band that was playing thought the noise was coming from their amplifiers!

Attended by 100, the Murrabit Hall was filled with smiles, laughter, and that unmistakable Murrabit community spirit while Damian Callinan kept the audience entertained. The evening finished with a supper fitting for a country hall, complete with a large enamel jug of the historic Murrabit Milk Coffee that did not disappoint!

Thank you to all who came along and helped make it such a memorable evening, and an additional thanks and congratulations to the Murrabit Hall Committee and Murrabit and District Heritage Group (pictured below) who worked tirelessly in setting up a magnificent display of the history of the Murrabit Hall to set the theme for the evening.

The performance was organised by Gannawarra Shire Council's partnerships team with thanks to funding from Creative Victoria and Regional Arts Victoria.

Regional Wellbeing Survey



Make Murrabit Count - Participate in the Regional Wellbeing Survey

Murrabit residents are encouraged to participate in the Regional Wellbeing Survey.

The annual Survey is run by the University of Canberra and is now in its 13th year.

The survey asks people living outside our big cities to share what's working, and what's not, in their communities. This year, with funding from the Gardiner Foundation, results from the survey will be used to develop a wellbeing framework and data dashboard for Gannawarra Shire. Dr Kim Houghton from the University of Canberra is encouraging Murrabit residents to complete the survey, go in the draw to win \$12,000 in prizes, and support donations to neighbourhood houses in Gannawarra Shire.

"The Survey helps us understand what makes your community so special, and what you need to support long-term wellbeing", said Dr Houghton.

"The Survey provides community leaders and organisations with access to local data that can help guide local planning" he said.

As well as the prize draw, completing the survey will also help raise money for Gannawarra's Neighbourhood Houses, as for each of the first 200 surveys completed by Gannawarra residents the University of Canberra will donate \$5 to the Neighbourhood Houses.


