Did you know that the Murrabit Hall was originally on the road to Benjeroop? Mr Bennett and Mr Morrison both offered to donate an acre of land for the hall, and as Mr Bennett's offer was accepted, the hall was built on the corner of Dawe Road and officially opened in

1912. The hall was about 5 metres shorter than it is now. The original tender to build the hall was 295 pounds (\$560 dollars). A concert and ball was held to celebrate the occasion and men were expected to wear gloves to preserve the ladies' fine dresses!

There are stacks of great stories around our hall that were celebrated as part of the *Hall Stories* production held at the hall in 2025 with renowned comedian and storyteller Damien Callinan. As 3 November 2026 is the 100th anniversary of the hall being on its current site, we will share more interesting snippets throughout this year.

The first ever community meal, cooked by community for community, was a fantastic success in February. A crowd of 45 people enjoyed the delicious meal coordinated by the Murrabit Crafty & Chatty Group who were well supported by a crew of helpers with set up, preparing the vegetables, wash up and pack up. The next community meal is on Wednesday 25 March. Bookings are essential (see flyer on page 3 of this newsletter for further information).

The Kerang Neighbourhood House took over the Market morning teas in the Hall at the March market. According to manager Claire, they all had a terrific time and a successful morning.

Students were busy during February participating in our swimming program at the Kerang Swimming Pool. This culminated in the Murray Plains Cluster Swimming Sports where our whole school competed against Leitchville PS, Gunbower PS and Koondrook PS. It was a fantastic day and the students did their very best, had great fun, and encouraged each other throughout the day. We did well enough to win the Shield again. Two students, Keira McNeil and Jade Lavey, have gone further and participated in the Mallee Zone Championships in Swan Hill, winning their breaststroke and freestyle respectively. They were also in the same relay teams, both medley and freestyle, and were successful in these. At the Loddon Mallee Regional Championships, Keira and Jade again acquitted themselves very well, finishing in the top three in both individual and relay events. A wonderful effort.

The students have been focusing on their curriculum programs, with staff prioritising Literacy and Numeracy, with NAPLAN testing taking place for the Grade 3 & 5 students. The Specialist programs are underway, with MARC (Library), MACC (Art), Italian and Music (Mrs Jones), as well as Science (Miss Bath) and PE (Mr Monaghan). The students are kept busy with this diverse curriculum.

This week the Junior School Council met and are excited about putting together some activities for all the students in the school. Our Junior School Council consists of all students in Grade 4-6 plus a representative from Grade P-3. Some of their ideas include a Colour Run, a special day at the Kerang Pool, a Sleepover, a fun day, and a sports clinic. All great ideas. The students in grade 6 will get the opportunity to further their leadership skills when they attend a GRIP Leadership Conference in Term 2 which is for Student Leaders and is held in Bendigo.

Our Grade 5 and 6 students are excited about going to Cottage By the Sea next week which is a Cluster Camp at Queenscliff. They should have a great time.

Our School Captains, Riley Danson and Emily Murray, made delicious slushies for the students. They were a big hit at the end of a hot day (pictured below).



Have your Say: Gannawarra Thriving Together Plan

The draft *Thriving Together 2026–2030 – a plan for a diverse, inclusive and resilient Gannawarra*, outlines Gannawarra Shire Council's commitment to strengthening community connection, equity, wellbeing and resilience. Funded by the Victorian and Commonwealth Governments through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) following the 2022 floods, the plan acknowledges the significant impact of natural disasters on rural communities and highlights the importance of social inclusion and connectedness in supporting recovery from adverse events.

The plan outlines Council's commitment to ensuring every resident feels valued, welcomed, safe and connected, while also meeting Council's requirement to develop and implement a Disability Action Plan,

The plan builds on the achievements of Council's Social Inclusion Strategy 2019–2023, which included the installation of three All Abilities Play Spaces in Kerang, Cohuna and Koondrook, a Changing Places facility at Atkinson Park in Kerang, and improved disability parking and footpaths as part of streetscape upgrades. Council also became a National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) provider to ensure local access to disability services. During this time, Council grew the local disability workforce, with the service and workforce ultimately transitioning to another local provider in 2023. The draft *Thriving Together* plan has been informed by feedback gathered through three community engagement activities: the review of the Social Inclusion Strategy 2019–2023, development of the Gannawarra Shire Council Plan 2025–2029 and 2040 Community Vision, and the six-month *Let's Talk About the Weather* program. Insights from more than 1,100 residents across these initiatives are reflected in the plan's strategies and actions, which focus on five priority areas: Welcoming and Connecting Communities; Improving Accessibility; Embracing and Valuing Diversity; Keeping the Community Informed; and Supporting Emergency Preparedness and Resilience.

"As we have seen during times of drought, floods and other adverse events, our residents come together to support one another," Mr Rollinson said.

"However, our community has also told us there are key priorities that Council can lead and support to better address the compounding impacts of adverse events, particularly the impact these events have on our small, agriculture-dependent communities.

"Alongside investments in emergency preparedness, the *Thriving Together* plan supports initiatives to reduce barriers, strengthen inclusion and enhance community connections through ongoing collaboration between Council, local organisations, schools, service providers, community groups, volunteers and residents." Residents can have their say on the draft *Thriving Together 2026–2030 – a plan for a diverse, inclusive and resilient Gannawarra* document up to 5pm **Friday, 17 April** one of the following ways:

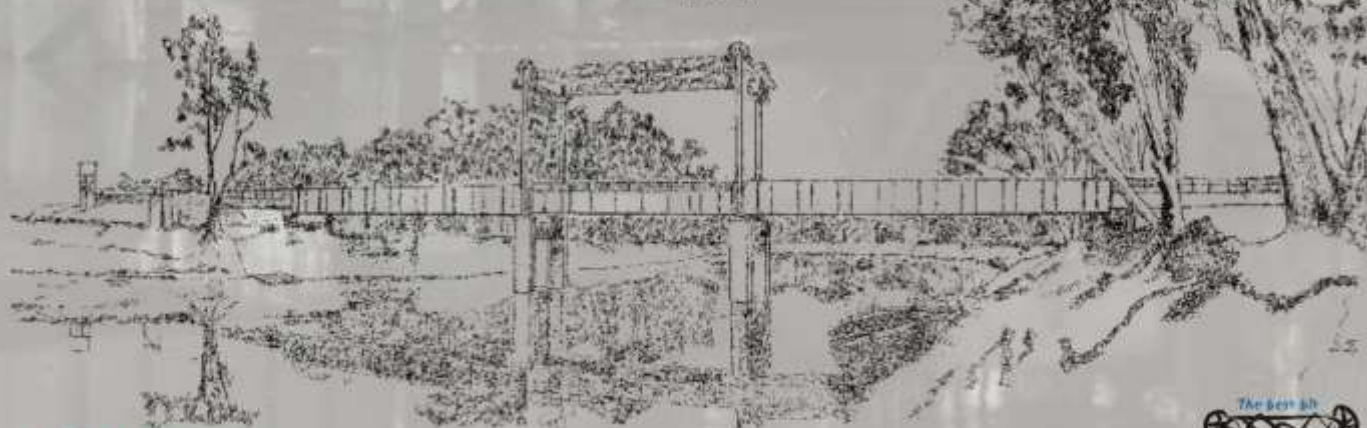

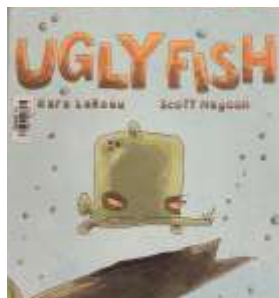
