Murrabit Heritage Group

On Monday 8 September, the Heritage Group and others travelled to the Bael Bael Homestead, located on the western lunette of Lake Bael Bael, between Kerang and Swan Hill. It was a beautiful sunny morning and we all enjoyed a talk by current owner, Brett Boyd, a walk around the property, and a picnic morning tea.

The homestead consists the house, shearing shed and stables building, believed to date from the 1870s.

The Bael Bael Run was created by the subdivision of Reedy Lake station which was established as a 370,000 acre station in 1845.

The house is constructed using a post and lintel frame of adzed hardwood timbers infilled with horizontal Murray pine drop logs. The plan is a regular grid of four square rooms off an unusually wide central hall. The central hall is almost the same width as the rooms. The roof structure is of unsawn bush timbers with sawn hardwood battens. The roof was initially clad with split timber shingles, some of which survive under the later cladding of corrugated iron. Bael Bael Homestead is of architectural significance as an outstanding and refined example of drop log construction. It is heritage listed and will soon undergo some work to stabilise the roof.

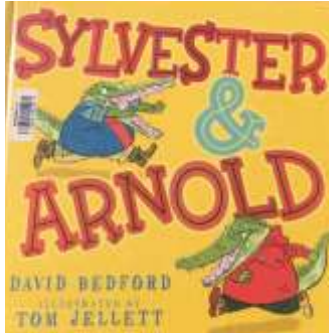
